Impact of Expenditure on Eligible and Other Pupils

In the academic year 2015/16:

The pupil premium funding was spent supporting children during the school day to access the curriculum and achieve their full potential through extra adult support (for specific 1:1 and in small groups) within and outside of the class. It was also used to provide extra resources to engage and support the children in their learning, or in extra curricula activities to support their social and mental health wellbeing.

The impact that the pupil premium had on pupils:

In general, school interventions had more positive outcomes in the 2015/16 academic year due to more specific targeting with more achievable and specific desired outcomes.

The majority of the pupil premium children made at least expected progress in maths, reading and writing, with some making more than expected progress. For the pupil premium children who did not make the expected progress, a significant number also had special educational needs for which they were receiving learning appropriate to their needs.
