## INSTRUMENT OF GOVERNMENT OF VOLUNTARY CONTROLLED SCHOOLS MADE BY DORSET COUNTY COUNCIL UNDER SCHOOL GOVERNANCE (CONSTITUTION) (ENGLAND) REGULATIONS 2012

- 1. The name of the school is Pimperne Church of England Voluntary Controlled Primary School.
- 2. The school is a voluntary controlled school.
- 3. The name of the governing body is "The Governing Body of Pimperne Church of England Voluntary Controlled Primary School."
- 4. The governing body shall consist of:
  - (a) 4 parent governors
  - (b) 1 Local Authority governor
  - (c) 1 staff governor
  - (d) 5 co-opted governors
  - (e) 3 foundation governors
  - (f) 1 Headteacher
- 5. Total number of governors: 15
- 6. The Salisbury Board of Education shall appoint the foundation governors, in consultation with the Parochial Church Council of the parish or ecclesiastical district in which the school is situated.
- 7. (a) The holder of the following office shall be a foundation governor ex officio

the Principal Officiating Minister of the parish or ecclesiastical district in which the school is situated.

- (b) The Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry in which the school is situated will appoint a foundation governor to act in the place of the ex-officio foundation governor whose governorship derives from the office named in (a) above, in the event that the ex-officio foundation governor is unable or unwilling to act as a foundation governor, or has been removed from office under regulation 23(2) of the Regulations.
- 8. The Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry in which the school is situated is entitled to request the removal of any ex-officio foundation governor and to appoint any substitute governor.
- 9. At Pimperne Church of England Voluntary Controlled Primary School, in a Christian atmosphere of faith and trust, we aim to provide a safe, supportive happy and stimulating environment for learning. Our motto, 'Celebrate, Believe, Aspire' reflects our passion for lifelong learning for all and it symbolises that we share a constantly

adapting vision to ensure individuals leave Pimperne Primary both knowing themselves and prepared for their future within a changing society. We aim for our school to always be an environment for being sociable and enjoying learning, we are outward facing and thrive in the pursuit of excellence. We maintain high expectations of the children and the adults who belong here. Our aspiration is to create resilient individuals who demonstrate our values, both British and those of our school which are rooted in Christianity. We aim to equip our pupils for the future, so they go forward knowing their strengths and having a strong moral compass to enhance their contribution to society.
