Cost of Living help for parents/carers to reduce Easter childcare costs

With the Easter school holidays nearly here, HM Revenue and Customs is reminding families not to miss out on government help to pay for childcare. Tax-Free Childcare can pay for any approved childcare for children aged 11 or under, or 16 if the child has a disability.

Working families, where each parent or carer earns up to £100,000 can use it, meaning for every £8 paid into an online account they will receive an additional £2 from the government. This means parents and carers can receive up to £500 every 3 months (£2,000 a year for each child), or £1,000 (£4,000 a year for each child) if their child is disabled. Opening a Tax-Free Childcare account is quick and easy.

OUR SCHOOL NEEDS YOUR HELP!

Did you know that registering for Pupil Premium means that your child's school gets extra money? Please take 5 minutes to check if you are eligible! Schools can decide how the Pupil Premium is spent, since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils within their responsibility.

At Pimperne Primary School we support all of our pupils. We do this by providing high quality classroom teaching which is supplemented by interventions to support venerable learners as and when required. The School Leadership Team and Governing Body monitor the impact of all spending and interventions including Pupil Premium. For further information please refer to the school 'Pupil Premium Policy'.

If you think you may be able to support your child's school further by completing the application due to low income or because your child is a Looked After or Cared for Child – please do! Every bit of additional funding the school receives plays a huge part in maintaining our belief in supporting every single child in our school.

Pupil Premium – most people who are in receipt of one of these are eligible for Pupil Premium Funding:

- Income Support
 Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment an Support Allowance

 Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

• The guaranteed element of Pension Credit

 \cdot Child Tax Credit. This is as long as you are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and your annual gross income isn't more than £16,190

· Working Tax Credit 'run-on' payment (paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

 \cdot Universal Credit with an income of no more than £7,400
