OUR SCHOOL NEEDS YOUR HELP!

Did you know that registering for Pupil Premium means that your child's school gets extra money?

Please take 5 minutes to check if you are eligible! Schools can decide how the Pupil Premium is spent, since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils within their responsibility. At Pimperne Primary School we support all of our pupils. We do this by providing high quality classroom teaching which is supplemented by interventions to support venerable learners as and when required. The School Leadership Team and Governing Body monitor the impact of all spending and interventions including Pupil Premium. For further information please refer to the school 'Pupil Premium Policy'.

If you think you may be able to support your child's school further by completing the application due to low income or because your child is a Looked After or Cared for Child – please do! Every bit of additional funding the school receives plays a huge part in maintaining our belief in supporting every single child in our school.

Pupil Premium – most people who are in receipt of one of these are eligible for Pupil Premium Funding:

- · Income Support
- · Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- · Income-related Employment an Support Allowance
- \cdot Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- \cdot The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- \cdot Child Tax Credit. This is as long as you are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and your annual gross income isn't more than £16,190
- · Working Tax Credit 'run-on' payment (paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- \cdot Universal Credit with an income of no more than £7,400

Summer Learning Pack

We are encouraging our children to have a go at some of these activities across the summer as it will support every child to be able to raise to the expectations of the school day in September, without feeling overwhelmed. A little a day (even 15 minutes, Monday to Friday) will help enormously.

The children are encouraged to bring this back into school to share with their team in the new academic year. Without your support, we are aware that the majority of children will regress in any new learning not yet committed to long-term memory. In school we rehearse continually and move children forward by re-visiting prior learning, especially for those children that are not yet automatic or fluent. Although this is a national consideration, we urge you to practice some of the pre-taught learning in order that your child can consolidate. The CGP books you may have purchased at the start of the year will be a great help. Please also look to use our online platforms such as 'Sumdog' and 'Times Tables Rockstars'. Some structure or routine during the 6 weeks of Summer will help children to settle back into school in September, ready for learning.

Reading - When parents read regularly with their children at home, the benefits are immense. Children make greater reading progress, they are more confident readers and, in many cases, develop a lifelong love of reading. Don't forget the Library Challenge this year - This year's Challenge, **Ready, Set, Read!** is all about games and sports. Children will join our fictional team (and their animal mascots!) as they use their skills to weave their way through a summer obstacle course. Developed in collaboration with Youth Sport Trust, the 2023 Summer Reading Challenge will celebrate play and participation, encouraging children to engage in games and sports in any way that best suits them. Ready, Set, Read! will showcase how reading can be active and engaged and can itself involve teamwork. With free rewards to collect and plenty of brilliant books to enjoy, the Challenge is the perfect summer activity to keep young minds and bodies active over the holidays. The Challenge is brought to life by the brilliant children's writer and illustrator, Loretta Schauer. To ensure all children know about Ready, Set, Read! - the library staff visited our school to tell the children all about this year's exciting challenge.
