After many years of discussions and meetings between the Governing Board and Multi Academy Trusts, we have now made the decision that it is in the school's best interests to proceed on our journey to join with a MAT. It has not been an easy decision but it is now one that I feel we are united and in full support of, due to the benefits for our children, their families and the staff. The Governing Board has unanimously agreed to move forward with the proposal to join HAMWIC Education Trust. The MAT 's vision strongly aligns with our own and the aim to put the child at the centre of everything we do, is lived out by Hamwic.

After the half term break, the Governing Board will write formally to you, to share the details of the proposal and invite your response, following a consultation. The date for the consultation with stakeholders will also come out to you as soon as possible, after our return from half term.



Dorset Reading Partners Information for Parents

Dorset Reading Partners is a local charity that provides schools with trained volunteers to help pupils with their reading development. Our volunteer reading partners work in primary schools right across the county.

What we do



Reading partners come into school at set times each week, and work one-to-one with selected pupils outside of the classroom. These thirty-minute sessions are designed to be fun; children can choose from a wide range of reading materials in our book box and enjoy their reading in a relaxed setting.

We have conversations about the books and play a variety of word games, so there's plenty of talking too. This individual support gives children an opportunity to build up their confidence and enjoyment of reading, as well as developing the literacy skills they have been taught in the classroom.

Each child works with their reading partner throughout the school year, and at the end they receive a certificate listing all the books they have read together.

Our reading partners



Our reading partners are members of the local community who want to share their love of reading with young people. They are carefully recruited and vetted, with enhanced DBS checks, and have comprehensive training before being placed in school.

Our staff make visits to observe reading partners in school and provide them with regular ongoing training and new resources. This ensures that your child receives the best possible support from our service.

Recent Visitors to our school

We have recently had visits from Dorset Councillors Jespersen, Quayle and Penfold who joined us for Collective Worship, toured the school, met with children in classes and left saying "The values you are instilling at this young age will stand your youngsters in good stead throughout their lives." and "Your children, your colleagues and your school were an absolute delight. We came away impressed and encouraged to see how much you are achieving. Your hard work shines through."

We have also been working with external improvement groups to further our good work in phonics and reading. A recent audit was very positive about the work we are doing to ensure that all learners have access to phonics and the priority we place on reading being absolutely key to every child being able to access the curriculum.


We continue to look for improvement that benefits our children... we still love learning, even as professionals!


